DO NOT EXPECT IMMEDIATE BREAK

AMSTERDAM, Wednesday.—The Berlin Taegliche Rundschau of Sunday's date attempts to lower the high expectations of the German people on the great offensive. The paper declares that it will be necessary to crush the British army before it is possible to break down resistance, and adds:—"If it is impossible after a short but severe artillery preparation to break through all the lines with our infantry, then we must not count on an immediate break through along the whole front."

Bar Gifts for Troops Abroad Unless Asked For

Requests, Approved by Regimental or Higher Commander, Must Accompany Each Parcel Post or Express Package in the Future, Major General Marsh Orders.

WASHINGTON, Wednesday.—Because an approved request for the same by the soldier to whom it is sent. Major General Marsh, Acting Chief of Staff, issued the order which forbids the postal authorities or express companies to accept any goods for the troops abroad without an approved request for them.

members of the American Expeditionary Forces abroad will be limited to those articles which have been requested by the individual to whom same is to be shipped, such requests having been approved by his regimental or higher commander. Parcel post shipments will be accepted by the Post Office authorities and other shipments by express or freight companies only upon presentation of the above approved request in each individual case.

WOUNDED BRITISH ARE SENT TO PARIS

PARIS, Wednesday.—The first lot of British wounded from the German offensive has reached Paris on board a special hospital train and were distributed among Paris hospitals. This is the first time British wounded have been sent here, although numbers passed through Paris during the early months of the war on their way to the Versailles Palace, which was then used as a British hospital.
